5. **PRONOUNS.** Plaintiff will determine the pronouns of all side-constrained Plaintiff witnesses. Defense will determine the pronouns of all side-constrained Defense witnesses. The pronouns of Sam Arnould, Danny Francazio, Devin Johar, and Casey Soto, as well as Dr. Jimin Kwon and Dr. R. Cannon, will be determined by the side calling the witness. The side calling Casey Soto will determine the pronouns of Genesis Petrillo. If Sam Arnould, Danny Francazio, Devin Johar, Casey Soto, Dr. Jimin Kwon, or Dr. R. Cannon will not be called, Plaintiff will determine the pronouns of that witness. If Casey Soto will not be called, Plaintiff will determine the pronouns of Genesis Petrillo.

- 6. **TIME LIMITS.** Each team has a combined total of 12 minutes for its opening statement and closing argument. All time remaining after opening statement will be reserved for closing argument. Each team has a combined total of 38 minutes for direct examination and cross examination. Each team must announce, in whole minutes, how much of its 38 minutes it designates for direct examination. The direct examination time selection must be 20, 21, 22, 23, or 24 minutes. The remainder of the 38 minutes will be the team's cross examination time. For example, if a team designates 23 minutes for direct examination, the team will have 15 minutes for cross examination. (Note: A team may not carry over unused time from direct examination to cross examination or vice versa. For example, if Plaintiff designates 24 minutes for direct examination but only uses 19 minutes on direct examination, Plaintiff's total cross examination time remains unchanged at 14 minutes.)

Objections based on the Midlands Rules of Evidence, however, may and must be made at trial.
